

**3-4 Granny Smith Apples 3-4 Gala Apples** 1 Lemon **1 Mandarin Orange** 2 Tbsp Flour 1/4 cup Sugar dash of Salt 1 Prepared pie dough

Place pie dough into pie dish of your choice. Put aside. Peel and slice apples. Grate lemon and orange, then juice. Mix apples with all ingredients. Pour into prepared pie shell.

**TOPPING: 1 cup Oatmeal** 1/4 cup Flour 1/4 cup Brown sugar 1 stick cold Butter Cut butter into small pieces. Place all ingredients in bowl and mix together with a pastry blender until combined. Pile on top of apples evenly.

Bake pie in a 350 degree oven for 60-70 minutes. I place my pie dish on a foil lined baking sheet in case of overflow in oven. Cool on a wire rack before slicing. ENJOY!

#### How to care for your Christmas *Poinsettia*

This popular Christmas plant, a native of Mexico, has been bred and improved upon greatly over the past few decades. Once there was only a red variety but today white, pink, and greenish yellow poinsettias are also available. Here are a few tips on how to keep yours happy and healthy through the holidays, and all year.

- Place in a cool, bright location out of direct sun and free from drafts or artificial heat.
- Poinsettias prefer nighttime temperatures of between 55 and 65 degrees, • and daytime temps around 70.
- Keep soil moist. Water enough to drain through; check daily and water • again when surface becomes dry.

- 1. When leaves begin to drop, let dry completely
- watering.
- Place outdoors in a warm, sunny location (minimum 60 degrees) 3.
- 4. Pinch off tips of new shoots when 6-8" long and again in late July; fertilize every two weeks.
- 5. Bring indoors before cold nights (early September) and place indoors in full sun.
- September through October)
- 7. Display your poinsettia plant.

#### Annual Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Breakfast on Jan 17



#### **OSC Village Daycare**

Happy New Year! During the month of December, our villagers enjoyed using their five senses to explore the holiday season. Every sense was utilized as we investigated smells, tastes, and sounds of this sensory heightened season. However, utilizing our sense of taste was hands down a villager favorite as they were able to sample delicious treats such as gingerbread, hot cocoa, and peppermint. We hope you enjoy the photos below for a few sensory highlights.







We're excited to blast off into 2022 with our village community as we dive into welcoming winter. This month we will expand upon the investigation work we did in December using our five senses. We start this month by focusing on snow. We will build snowmen out of real snow while feeling the cold, icy texture, create our own blizzards, and explore proper warm winter attire. During this week, our villagers will work on identifying and naming essential winter gear used to keep us warm including hats, gloves, scarves, and coats. Our villagers will continue dressing themselves by using the magical coat trick and will practice dressing our beloved baby dolls for a cold winter day.

The next two weeks of January will lead us into learning about Arctic animals. We will spend one week studying Arctic land animals such as Polar Bears, The Arctic Wolf, Snowy Owls, Arctic Hares and Caribou. We will continue to use our senses to discover how these specific animals communicate, the way their fur looks and feels, and how they survive in their Arctic habitat. Next, we will move to Artic animals of the seas. Throughout this week we will discover Artic Sea animals such as the Beluga Whale, penguins, Narwhals, Walrus, and Harp seals. We will spend ample time this week engaging in our sensory bins where we will recreate the Arctic habitat with both land and sea animals and lots of ice blocks. This unit will enable our children to understand how cold the Arctic environment is and why these animals have certain adaptations to keep them warm.

After spending two weeks on different Arctic Animals, will begin to learn about animals who aren't able to adapt to live in very cold temperatures so they must hibernate or migrate. During this week we will explore bears, squirrels, birds and butterflies. During this unit our villagers will explore how animals depend upon the environment for food, water and shelter.

We are scheduled to have four new families join our village family during this month, and three new infants scheduled to begin the month of February. All three of these infants have something very special in common. All three are siblings of past and present villagers. It is truly special to be able to grow with our village families. Unfortunately, time flies in our village, and just as we begin welcoming new infants we had to say goodbye to toddlers who've aged out of our program. At the end of December, we had to say goodbye to one of our toddler villagers who graduated to The Early Learning Center. He will be greatly missed, but we know he'll be in good hands with our colleagues from upstairs.
