

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F

- 1 cup Sugar 1 Egg 2 cups Flour 1/4 cup Molasses 1 tsp Salt 1 tsp Cinnamon
- 2/3 cup Canola or Vegetable Oil 2 tsp Baking Soda 1/2 tsp Ground Cloves



1 heaping tsp Ground Ginger

Mix together Sugar, Egg, Oil and Molasses. Mix all dry ingredients together then add everything together. Make into little balls, roll in sugar, place on baking sheet. Bake at 350 for 9 to 10 minutes. Don't overcook. I usually double the recipe when I make them, and use a wee bit more oil.

1 cup Water 1/2 cup Oatmeal

Mix all ingredients together with love and respect. Microwave on high for 2 minutes. Remove from microwave and enjoy with gratitude or a topping that you like such as maple syrup or honey.

Lime Poppy Seed Scones Submitted by Heidi Manley for publication in The Herald

2 cups Flour	1/4 cup Sugar	1/2 tsp salt
1 Tbsp Baking Powder	1/2 cup unsalted Butter	2 Tbsp Lime Zest
2 Tbsp Poppy Seeds	2 Tbsp Lime Juice	1 Egg
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For Glaze: Mix 1/2 C 10X Sugar with 1 Tbsp Lime Juice. 1 Cup Sour Cream

Instructions: Mix flour, sugar, salt, and baking powder together in a bowl. Cut in the butter with a pastry blender until resembles the size of peas. Stir in lime zest and poppy seeds. Combine the lime juice, egg and sour cream in a bowl. Make a well in the flour mixture and add the lime egg mixture. Stir with a fork just until combined. Gently knead to bring dough together. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and pat to 1/2 inch thickness. Cut into shapes as desired. Place on an ungreased baking sheet, spacing them 1/8 inch apart. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Glaze when cooled. Top with a bit of lime zest for an extra flare.

8 cups Broccoli Florets 1/2 cup Ren Onion (chopped)

6 to 8 strips Bacon (cooked and crumbled) 1/2 cup Raisins

Cook bacon, cool and crumble. In a large bowl, combine broccoli, onion, bacon and raisins.

Dressing: 1 cup Mayonnaise 1/4 cup Sugar 2 Tbsp Vinegar

In small bowl, whisk dressing ingredients together.

Add dressing to broccoli mix and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour. Serve and enjoy. Yield 10-12 servings



<u>May Recap</u>

We had an incredible May as we celebrated our staff of Old Stone Village.

We originally planned to honor our teachers with a best under the big top theme, but with the outpouring of love and tremendous support from our village families we decided to honor our staff with a different theme each day. We began with our "Best Under the Big Top" theme where teachers were able to treat themselves with a "create your own popcorn" bar. Each teacher also received their favorite circus candy to add to their popcorn. On Tuesday, we recognized our All-Star Teacher line up with a sports theme where our teachers received fan mail from their students and Ms. Nicole was able to secure past sports photos of all our staff from their own mothers. All of these past photos decorated our hall so our children and families could see pictures of their teachers as children. Throughout this day teachers also received their favorite stadium snacks and beverages to snack on. Wednesday, we honored our staff with a superhero day where each staff member received a Superhero T-shirt and personalized drawing from their class on why their teacher was a superhero or what superpower their teacher has. On Thursday we celebrated Cinco de Mayo with a "Nacho Average Teacher" theme. Teachers received a special Mexican lunch and shared some fun celebratory Mexican dancing and pinatas with the students. On Friday, we concluded our week with a "How Sweet It Is to Be Taught By You" theme. All families sent in their child's teachers favorite sweet treats. One of our village parents even set up an ice cream sundae bar for our staff to indulge in. Prior to this week, all teachers were asked to complete a favorite thing survey. This survey was sent out to all parents and many parents also surprised teachers throughout the week with fun surprises and gifts from their individual surveys. We had such a fun time celebrating our staff for all the hard work they do each day.



One of our key science topics this month is Living Things and Their Interactions with the Environment and Each Other. Our classrooms are currently working on the standard S.24.3 to observe Living Things and to Observe how a variety of living things obtain food as a source of energy for surviving. One of our favorite learning activities in May is when our caterpillars arrive, and we begin watching our caterpillars complete their lifecycle with their metamorphosis into a butterfly. Our villagers observed as our tiny caterpillars ate and grew, formed into their chrysalis', and eventually emerged as beautiful Monarch butterflies. On Friday, May 20th we had the privilege of releasing these butterflies into our Village Garden. During the second week of May we began our unit on the Zoo, another favorite topic in our Village. Our villagers continued to expand on their observation of living things when our very own Ms. Jessie brought in her pet Turtle and Gecko while we explored the World of Reptiles in our Zoo unit. We also explored snakes, frogs, and alligators during this week where our villagers participated in many sensory experiences with models of these animals. We indulged in numerous sensory exploration activities, sang some of our favorite reptile inspired songs, and even got to examine a real alligator head close with our magnifying glasses.











Our next week took us into the African Savanna, where we encountered animals such as the Elephant, Giraffe, Zebra, Hippo, Rhino and Lions. Our villagers spent their time this week comparing these animals' habitats, foods they eat, and assumed different roles as honorary zookeepers in taking care of these animals. Some of our villagers' favorite duties included washing muddy elephants, feeding tall giraffes, and keeping our animals healthy with a visit to our zoo vet. Our infants even joined in on some special sensory exploration as they helped Hippos through their chocolate pudding "mud", fed a giraffe some tasty leaves, and created their own handprint "Zoo" to take home at the end of the week. Throughout this week our villagers were also able to observe the lifecycle of ladybugs. Did you know that ladybugs start off as tiny black beetles with no wings or spots? Our villagers loved watching these tiny insects triple in size and begin to completely change like our caterpillars.





During the month of May, we also began voting for Old Stone Village for the Best of the Shoreline Community Choice Awards. Last year we placed third for Childcare Centers and are hoping to obtain the first-place title this year. Please help us achieve this honor by voting at <u>www.zip06.com/beston2022#</u>. The Month of June takes us from the Zoo to the Aquarium. This first week we dive down deep into the tropical waters to explore various tropical fish, sharks, dolphins, Jellyfish, and stingrays. Our Villagers will explore through outdoor sensory play in our new sensory table we've acquired for our outdoor playground area. Each day we will add a new creature to our table, so the children really begin to see the interactions and explore the different qualities of each of these creatures. The second week of June brings us to visit our cold-water friends such as various whales, penguins, lobsters, and Walrus'. We will integrate ice and icebergs into our sensory exploration as our little scientists get to investigate the differences between the warm water friends from the previous week and the cold-water creatures of the second week as they compare and contrast the various aspects that make these creatures so different. The third week of June will take us out of the water and onto the beach for our annual "Beach Days" unit. Through this unit we will explore the sun, water and waves, sand and sandcastles, crabs and a variety of different shells. With all hope this week we will be able to spend the majority of our time outdoors enjoying some waterplay to go along with this week's topics. The next week we will celebrate the First Official Day of Summer with our "Signs of Summer" unit. This unit will explore things such as summer treats, outdoor games and a mock "cook-out" with our Villagers in our play grill. We wrap up June with a Camping unit. This unit is a huge hit with our Villagers as they get to enjoy some fantastic pretend play with tents, mock campfires, s'mores and flashlight experiments!

Old Stone Village is so blessed to have the amazing families we have had as part of our Village over the last (almost) 3 years! We will begin our "goodbyes" to our graduating Toddlers in the month of June as some of our graduates begin summer programs within their new school environments. It is so bittersweet to send off these children as this class was our first Infant class when we opened in 2019 and many of them have been part of our OSV families since they were tiny babies. Watching them grow over the years and blossom into beautiful young scholars has been such a journey. August we will have our second annual graduation ceremony and send 17 more children off to various preschools come the new school year.
