1 (16oz) Bag Cabbage, shredded 1 (8oz) can Pineapple bits, cut 1/2 cup Raisins
1 cup Mayonnaise

into cubes, reserve juice 1 Med. Apple, cut into cubes 2 Tbsp. Apple Cider Vinegar3 Tbsp. Reserved Pineapple Juice

1 cup Chopped Celery

Combine coleslaw mix, pineapple, apple, celery and raisins. In small bowl, blend mayonnaise, vinegar and pineapple juice. Add mayonnaise mixture to cabbage mixture, toss gently until well mixed. Chill for several hours or overnight. ENJOY!

6 quarts Popped Corn 1 tsp. Salt 1 cup Butter 1/2 tsp. Ba

1/2 tsp. Baking Soda

2 cups Brown Sugar 1 tsp. Extract (vanilla, coconut, almond, or rum)

1/4 cup Light Corn Syrup

In medium pan cook butter, brown sugar and corn syrup. Boil 5 minutes without stirring. Remove from heat, add baking soda and your favorite extract. On a greased cookie sheet with sides, pour sugar/caramel mixture over popcorn. With two wooden spoons, mix to coat. Bake

250 degrees for approx. I hour. You can add a favorite nut for extra taste prior to baking. Cool and enjoy.



Did you know? Church services in East Haven were first held in 1679 in both the old school house and private homes. On October 8, 1711 the East Haven Church Congregational, was founded. The present "Meeting House" is believed to be the second oldest stone sanctuary in New England. Redevelopment in East Haven today focuses around the old church with its tall spire visible for a mile in many directions. Lighted at night, it is an inspiring symbol of faith in America.
